I write with a real sense of God helping us and being supported by so many good friends back in the U.K. Now that life is settling into something of a routine I'd like to paint a picture of our days here, but first I must share how blessed we have been.

We have been able to completely furnish our new home, even with a hoped for piano! Yes, wonderfully we are sorted on that and can now give our full attention to the priority of the purpose for which we are here. Folk here were surprised that we are settled and equipped to live here as residents within just 4 weeks. Dean (EP director) & Wendy are back in Canada until August and have kindly given us the use of their car, so we're mobile as well.

We are very grateful to have been so well received by the team here. They have opened their hearts and we feel truly at home. It is same in the churches too; I have preached in a few already and each time we have been received with appreciation.

DAILY TIMETABLE

Each day brings fresh challenges and experiences, but some things are constant. We have started meeting as a team each day for worship & prayer 8.00am. Kay then takes up her position at the EP reception until 4pm where she takes the post; visitors' enquiries; telephone calls and bookshop customers. She also deals with all cash requirements

One month before we arrived, the accounts lady resigned; two weeks after we arrived Dean and Wendy suddenly left for Canada earlier than expected, as her elderly mum was preparing to leave for heaven. She passed away 2 days later with Wendy at her side. They return here in August in time to cover our visit to the UK. More recently the long-time IT lady announced her departure. She leaves here 23rd April for 2-3 months at home in Canada before taking up a new role elsewhere in Africa.

So here we find ourselves: in totally new surroundings; with a very trimmed down team; with an enormous challenge before us, but with a God who specializes in showing His power against such odds! It is a *new day*, and therefore we need new vision, resources, personnel and provision.
