It's been rather different for us as we wait week after week

However, we enjoyed a lovely day last month in Kaapschehoop, a little rural town outside Nelspruit.

After a rocky climb under a blue sky we were rewarded with fantastic views.

Encouragingly, our painter, an older man, says he wants to know Jesus. He says he loves being on our premises as it makes him "feel so good and happy".

Our "homegroup" is being blessed as we move around our homes so different ones can host our evenings together. Our current theme is the book of 1 Peter, looking at the challenge he brings to the churches. This month we've got involved with an ALPHA initiative at Calvary Church, attended by nearly 20 guests.

The other Sunday we celebrated our friend Tony's 60th. In the 1990s he created the artwork for EP tracts and lessons. I wrote him a
