Hello dear friends, I'm sitting at my desk in locked down White River. Could we have imagined that 2020 would have seen such extraordinary days? A few prophetic words heralded change, but this was not expected by most. The crisis so many are experiencing has been real, personal and often painful. The ramifications have yet to be felt, and questions are multiplied for individuals, families, businesses, communities and whole countries.

The South African government called a lockdown just after the UK: No walking out or leaving home except for food, medical aid & a few other extreme needs. This has meant the closure of Emmanuel Press: no school or prison visits and no visitors to our premises, not even the postman. The mission of EP is halted, except for email students, but these too have been slowed as our staff here cannot attend. A wisp of good news is that we have connected with some students via our Facebook page as Kay posts daily encouragement.

Now I can tackle this large project with minimal distractions. The 12 lesson course on John's Gospel is my focus right now.

To maintain the momentum of our leaders' teaching sessions I'm trying my hand at WhatsApp audio

messaging. I've found a few gardening tasks to help keep me fit as well. However, Kay and I feel deeply that our priority must be thus:

We have set ourselves to seek The Lord our God: to hear His Word and to pray

His prayers (Romans 8:26-28). It is SO GOOD to know Father's presence as we bring our lives more into line with His holy purposes. Extra to our usual early morning personal devotions, we are taking a couple of hours to read HIS Word out loud. God's Word is alive. His presence is real. His peace is powerful. We want to give God more personal time than we give to any other attention-grabbing gadgets.
