Hello again from South Africa, where it's well into autumn here in the southern hemisphere. We've been in Lockdown Land for about fifty days and, like many other places, there are signs that many people are struggling to maintain the level of lockdown the government demands. Face masks are now mandatory for anyone venturing out. It's a legal requirement with fines if you offend. Kay got busy making some, but it's good to have a

spare, so we've some shop-bought models too.

It's been a mixed month and we are so grateful for the 'family' of EP residents that have softened the sense of isolation. Last week we had a staff team meeting onsite. For the foreseeable future we cannot have an open door to the public but the eight of us met to talk, pray & decide the best legal way forward. To help us all and to continue with behind-the-scenes responsibilities, we plan to all be here each Wednesday morning. During the rest of the week those of us on site can fulfil any necessary duties.

Sunday mornings together continue to be a blessing. At 9am in the carport we worship Jesus then focus on The Written Word of God and prayer. It's then time for a cuppa and some home-made cake before we join the youtube livestream from The Vine Church, our home church back in Cranbrook.

Last week's highlight was being able to baptise a new believer in Jesus! Darrel had come to stay on site with his parents during lockdown. Unexpectedly for him, Jesus met him on our first Sunday; he says his life has
