I am in discussions with a keen Christian contact here in the UK regarding openings in Malawi where we may have a base to distribute our Basic Discipleship Course and other related teaching subjects.
A doorway is opening whereby we may be able to assist an excellent Christian charity working in several Central and West African countries. This

Now able to sing, greet and be together, and that with the bonus of sitting in the open under mostly blue skies. When did you last listen to preaching with just a little rain to whet your determination and commitment? We could hear the birds singing as we sang, all to a backcloth of beautiful trees and green grass. It brings a fresh meaning to 'open meetings'.



Back at base-camp in White River our IT worker has just been blessed with a new baby boy, Micah, born on 1st June. Mum, dad and 4yr old big brother, are all doing fine. A WhatsApp call this week reminded us that we are currently enjoying warmer weather in Kent than our team of friends in White River as they step deeper into winter.

Pray for us as we 're-imagine' the shape and strategy of Emmanuel Press. Relying on the Post Office is past as it is increasingly ineffective. Using people to tell, take and train is very 1st century, but I see it working in 21st century living. God's church is His avenue of telling and teaching. Please also pray that we learn to adapt and sync

with other worthy organisations aiming for similar fruitfulness in God's purposes.

Finally, thank you again for helping us pursue this vision. "Working from home" has its challenges when its half way round the world, but we are persisting and see signs of encouragement.
